2) Project Report

Key Projects

Held regional chapter leaders meetings in Singapore and Oita.

A total of 29 chapters participated in the meetings. They shared their visions of the APU Alumni Association and budget and exchanged information between each chapter.

Group Activities: "APU Startup Founders" held several events in Tokyo.

In addition, two groups were established.

One is "APU Researchers and Educations Network." It promotes network building and interaction of graduates and students who engaged in study and education.

Another is "APU Kids School." It provides cross-cultural understanding experiences to children of alumni.

Support developed for Loop.A.S., a group of current APU students who support alumni activities.

Assisted with the establishment of the Hokuriku chapter.

Publicized Alumni Association activities at graduation and entrance ceremonies.

Granted the APU Alumni Social Development Grant, which supports graduate activities for the development of local communities.

Support for current students and the university

Invited alumni to campus to give lectures in regular classes or events as part of efforts to support current students (GOAL).

Held events where current students could interact with alumni and other initiatives aimed at ensuring current students can lead fulfilling lives at university.

Continued supporting student activities and providing financial assistance (¥90,000).

Supported LoopA.S. activities (¥245,772).

Donated ¥200,000 worth of books to the APU Library.

Sponsorships: GBCC (¥100,000), JBCC (¥100,000).

The "Support Change Makers" was constructed mainly by APU Alumni Association to be the framework of the university's donations.
